CHRIST LK 1:26-38.

It was the 6th month of Elizabeth's pregnancy when the Angel Gabriel to Nazareth a town in Galilee.

According to Luke, the virgin young woman's name was

Among the Langi, the birth of the baby can be describe as follows.

After 9 month of pregnancy, a Langi woman is expected to deliver.

During this period, she either stayed at the husband's home or she went back to her parents home.

There; she was kept inside the house under the care of a mid wife who was an elderly woman.

Men were not allowed inside the room she was to deliver from.

Only the pregnant woman and the elderly women were allowed in the room.

At delivery, the mid wife could cut the umbilical cord and the placenta.

The umbilical cord was kept in the pot and later buried underground.

The women inside shouted for joy at delivery.

This made the elderly men outside know that the delivery was alright.

When the child born was a boy, he was kept in seclusion for 3 days and if it was a girl for 4 days.

At the end of the seclusion, the mother of the baby was made to come out with the winnow on her head.

She was taken to the granary where the child is passed under a granary to the other side of the elderly woman.

The name was given to the child immediately the child was born.

The name was usually given by one of the members in the clan.

After seclusion, gifts of hens, goats were given to the elders whose names had been given to the child.

There was then celebration where people danced, sang and

He told government workers not to cheat the people they serve.

He told government workers not to abandon their work, but to do it honestly.

He told soldiers not to take away money from anybody by force.

He told soldiers not to accuse anybody falsely.

He told soldiers to be ^{contented} content with their pay.

He told the people that he was a humble man and he came to baptise with water.

He told the people that a great man was arriving who would baptise them with the holy spirit and fire.

He told King Herod to stop his evil marriage with Herodias the wife of his brother Philip.

How How DID JOHN THE BAPTIST PREPARE THE WAY FOR THE MESSIAH?

He called upon the Jews to repent for their sins and be ready for the Messiah who was coming.

He condemned the Jews boasting that they were descendants of Abraham, and yet they were not as faithful as Abraham, ^{was} as one way of preparing them for the Messiah.

John told the Jews to make all roads straight as they prepared for the messiah who was coming.

He told the rich to share with the poor so that one with two gives one shirt to a person with none, as they prepared for the messiah who was coming.

He told tax collectors to stop being corrupt and be content with pay as they prepared for the messiah who was coming.

He told the Jews to practice Justice as they prepared for the messiah who was coming.

He told the Jews that he was baptizing them with water but the one who was coming was to baptize them with the holy spirit and fire.

He told the Jews the time of messiah had come as the Old Scriptures had said.

He told the people that he was not greater than the messiah, extent that he was not good enough even to untie his sandals.

He baptized Jesus Christ in the river Jordan which proved that Jesus was also a human being like any other human being and would have doubted him.

He advised people to live holy life and do what is right as they prepared for the messiah who was coming.

He introduced Jesus Christ to the crowd after baptizing him and told them that He was the Lamb of God and Saviour of all men.

He introduced Jesus to his disciples and even handed over some to him and they became the first disciples of Jesus.

They learn to baptize new converts to Christianity just as John the Baptist baptized those who repented of their sins.

They learn to do missionary work as John the Baptist did the work of preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God.

They learn to walk upright in the ~~right~~ sight of God as John the Baptist walked upright as the prophet of God.

They learn to seek for God's holy spirit on them as they serve him just as John the Baptist had the holy spirit on him as he served God.

They learn to accept Jesus as their saviour just as John the Baptist prepared people to accept Jesus the saviour.

They learn to humble themselves before Jesus the messiah just as the Baptist he went first to baptise Jesus and as he came for baptism which was a sign of humbling himself.

They learn **THE BAPTISM OF JESUS** [Lk 3:21-22].

When Jesus was about 30 years old He came to John the Baptist to baptise him.

John was baptising people in the river Jeh Jordan.

As Jesus was being baptised, the heavens opened and the holy spirit came down upon him in form of a dove.

A voice from heaven was heard saying "You are my own dear son, I am pleased with you".

SIGNIFICANCE / IMPORTANCE OF JESUS' BAPTISM.

His baptism showed that He approved of John the Baptist's ministry hence it revealed that He respected John the Baptist's work.

It showed that Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament scriptures about the messiah Old Testament prophet like Isaiah had announced.

It showed his divine nature since as he was being baptised, the heavens opened which showed him as a super human being.

It showed his human nature since he was baptised by John the Baptist like other people were baptised by the same person.

"You are my own dear son, I am pleased with you", God said his love for Jesus.

It associated Jesus with the sinners he had come to save.

It showed the holy trinity of God the father, God the son and God the holy spirit where the voice from heaven represented God the father, the dove, God the holy spirit and Jesus God the son.

It showed Jesus as the messiah since as he was being baptized God's voice from heaven showed him as a special son of God.

It showed the messianic secrecy of Jesus since he was tempted in the desert alone hiding away his messiahship from the rest of the people.

It showed that Jesus was identifying himself with the sinful man by offering himself to suffer in order to save that sinful man.

It empowered Jesus to be ready for future temptations in his ministries where he was to face forces of Satan trying to ~~oppose~~ ^{oppose} him.

It showed Jesus had come to defeat the devil and would even defeat future forces of Satan opposing him.

It showed that Jesus was the suffering type of messiah since his temptations in the desert involved suffering.

It showed Jesus' obedience to the will of God his father since he had the option either to accept the devil's temptations or to remain committed to God's will of saving sinful man.

It meant the starting battle between Jesus the son of God and the forces of Satan.

It meant the importance of the Holy Spirit in Jesus' ministry, which the Holy Spirit Jesus had received during the baptism and it enabled him to overcome Satan's temptations.

It meant that being tempted is not a sin but it is only a sin when a person accepts the demands of the temptations.

It encourages to accept temptations as part and parcel of their lives as they were part and parcel of Jesus' life.

Positively, temptations have the following effects to Christians.

They strengthen the Christians' character to become strong and overcome those temptations.

Temptations increased a Christians' faith in God

They bring a Christian to God by committing himself to God for help.

They encourage Christians to pray to God.

They make Christians humble before others.

They encourage Christians to read the bible and know more about ^{the word of} God.

They encourage Christians to maintain holy lives.

They encourage Christian to work hard so that they get what ever they want and overcome temptations.

Temptations encourage christians to take Jesus' example by accepting to be tempted and resist.

However, negatively temptations affect the christians in the following ways.

They may lead a christian into more sinning especially when they are defeated by the temptations.

They may make a christian to lose faith in God thinking that God no longer cares.

Some temptations force a christian to completely turn away from God especially when they have greatly sinned.

Temptations bring misery and suffering to christians.

Temptations spoil the relationship between a christian and God because when man accepts temptation become a sinner.

Temptations leads to enmity among christians especially those who attempted to harm others.

Temptations promote laziness to those christians who are unable to resist them and end up committing more evil like stealing.

Temptations force some christians to cut God.

JESUS BEGINS HIS PUBLIC MINISTRY IN GALILEE AND HE IS REJECTED IN NAZARETH [4:14-30].

As a faithful Israelite, Jesus attended a service in the synagogue.

The service involved prayers & readings from the law and prophets, a sermon, its explanation and a blessing.

Any one of high learning could be invited to read and give a comment on the reading.

Visiting rabbis / teachers were often given ~~over~~ the honour of addressing the congregation.

When Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he entered the synagogue on the sabbath as he usually did.

He stood up to read the scriptures and they handed him the book of prophet Isaiah.

Jesus then unrolled the scroll and found it was written "The spirit of the Lord is upon me and he has anointed to bring good news to the

To proclaim liberty to the captives and to give a new sight to the blind
To free the oppressed and announce the Lord's year of mercy". [Isaiah 61:1-2]

After reading the passage, Jesus rolled up the scroll, gave it to the attendant and sat down.

All the eyes of those in the synagogue were fixed on him.

Jesus then started to explain the text and said "Today these prophetic words have come true as you listen".

He continued to explain about the Kingdom of God all were amazed.

REASONS WHY JESUS WAS REJECTED IN NAZARETH

Jesus was a suffering Messiah yet Jesus expected a political Messiah hence rejecting him.

Jesus performed miracle in Capernaum yet he didn't perform miracle in Nazareth his own town leading to his rejection.

Jesus called himself son of God and yet no one in Israel was expected to call himself son of God. Since the Jews knew that God was one and he didn't have a son leading to his rejection.

Jews in Nazareth expected Jesus to favour them over other villages only to be surprised Jesus performed miracles in other villages like Capernaum and not in Nazareth hence his rejection.

Jesus told the Jews in the temple that their forefathers had rejected God's prophets by persecuting and killing them during the time of Elijah which annoyed the Jews hence rejecting him.

Jesus came from a very poor family of Mary and Joseph the carpenter yet Jews expected the messiah to come from a very rich family hence rejecting him.

Jesus associated with gentiles saying they are the people he had come to save yet the Jews expected the Messiah to be only for the Jews hence his rejection.

Jesus associated with sinners such as prostitutes and tax collectors which lowered him as the Messiah hence causing his rejection.

Jesus' close friends were people of low status like some of his disciples were fishermen yet Jews expected a Messiah of high status hence his rejection.

Jesus violated the Mosaic laws concerning the Sabbath when he healed the sick on Sabbath yet Jews didn't expect any Jew to do anything on Sabbath hence they rejected him.

Jesus condemned Pharisees and Sadducees as sinners fit for eternal destruction which made Sadducees to reject such Jews to reject him.

Jesus supported his disciples to work on Sabbath when they picked corn in the garden as they were passing which appeared that he was supporting the breaking of the laws of Sabbath hence his rejection.

Jesus supported his disciples not to fast yet the disciple of the Pharisees and John the Baptist were fasting hence his rejection.

Jesus claimed to forgive sins yet according to the Jews God alone had power to forgive sins hence according to them Jesus was committing a sin.

a sin blasphemy (taking up God's power, authority and position).

Jesus' disciples never followed Jewish customs like one time they never washed their hands before eating food leading to the rejection of Jesus their master.

Jesus cleansed the temple chasing out all the people who were selling from it yet to them this was the source of income leading to his rejection.

Jesus called Jewish religious leader hypocrites because they were emphasizing Mosaic laws yet they weren't following them in reality which annoyed them hence rejecting him.

Jesus was becoming more popular than the Jewish religious leaders because of the many miracles he was performing hence rejecting him because of taking away their followers.

Jesus used extraordinary authority in his preaching which attracted many listeners to him compare to Jewish religious leading to his rejection.

Jesus indirectly attacked Jewish religious leaders like in the parable of the wicked tenants where he showed them as killers leading to his rejection.

Jesus said that for one to enter in the kingdom of heaven, he himself has to take up his cross and follow Jesus and such conditions look so hard leading to his rejection.

Jesus said that even gentiles and foreigners would be saved yet according to the Jews, salvation was only for them hence Jesus' rejection.

Jesus didn't have a wife yet some Jews gave great respect to marriage hence rejecting him.

HOW DO PEOPLE REJECT JESUS TO DAY?

By not believing in him where some say Jesus was a leader of for the Jewish not Africans.

By fighting against the church leaders where some people grab and sell church land.

By practicing witchcraft yet a Christian is supposed to worship God alone the father.

By being corrupt yet according to Jesus his followers should live upright lives.

(MIRACULOUS CATCH OF FISH (Lk 5:1-11)).

Who is a disciple?

The word disciple means a follower in the bible.

The word disciple refers to the learners who followed a particular master to learn more about religious matters or scriptures eg John the baptist some of whom became the first disciples of Jesus Christ (John 1:35:51).

Jesus chose his disciples from among the many people who followed him to listen to his teachings.

This lake had fresh water and it was a favourite lake for the fish.

While people crowded around Jesus, eager to listen to the word,

The fishermen had left their boats on the shores and were washing their net.

Jesus got into one of the boats which belonged to Simon Peter, he sat in it and taught the crowd.

When he had finished teaching, he asked Simon to cast the nets into the sea for a catch.

But Simon answered, "Master, we have worked hard all night long and caught nothing.

But if you say so, I will let down the net."

Then Simon, James and John sons of Zebedee let down their nets.

They caught such a large number of fish that their nets almost broke.

Simon Peter was deeply moved by the miraculous catch of fish.

He fell on his knees before Jesus and said "Go away from me Lord, I am a sinful man.

James and John too were amazed at the miraculous catch of fish.

Jesus told Simon not be afraid because from that time on, he would be catching men.

Here Jesus meant that Simon was going to be one of his disciples and would be winning souls for the kingdom of God.

The three men Simon, James and John left everything and followed Jesus becoming his first disciples.

Qw:

What do Christians learn from the call of first disciples of Jesus.

Christians learn to obey God's voice and call just as Simon, James and John left everything and followed Jesus as a sign of obedience.

They learn to humble themselves before God just as Simon Peter humbled himself ^{fell} on his knees before Jesus and declared himself a sinful man.

They learn to confess their sins before God through Jesus Christ just as Simon declared himself a sinful man before Jesus on his knees.

They learn to accept God's call regardless of their background since God calls any body of his choice. The same way he called Simon, James and John who were just fishermen through Jesus Christ.

They learn to associate with all people regardless of status, just as Jesus associated with all people including Simon, James and John who were just fishermen and people of low status.

They learn to fish sinners to Christ just as Simon, James and John were called by Jesus to begin fishing men for the Kingdom of God.

They learn to show faith in God just as Simon showed faith in Jesus by saying "but if you say so, I will let down the net".

They learn to repent of their sins just as Peter knelt before Jesus and said "Go away from me Lord; I am a sinful man.", which was a sign of repenting.

They learn to search for God's miracle through Jesus Christ who made Simon, James and John catch such a large number of fish that their nets almost broke.

They learn to co-operate when preaching the gospel, just as Simon, James and John were called to assist Jesus in catching men for the Kingdom of God.

They learn to have hope through Jesus Christ since with him everything is possible just as he ~~met~~ ^{made} Simon, James and John to catch a lot of fish having failed the whole previous night.

They learn to work in order to eat just as Simon, James and John working through fishing before Jesus called them to be fishers of men.

They learn exercise self sacrifice as they serve God just as Simon, James and John left everything including their fish, nets, boats and even families and followed Jesus.
